Survivor

Since I turned 40, I've been good about getting my annual mammograms. On July 23, 2008 I had my fifth annual mammogram and the results came back normal (no evidence of cancer). In November, 2008 I began to feel a thickening in my right breast. By December the thickening was an unmistakable lump. The doctor ordered another mammogram and ultrasound. On December 23, 2008, exactly five months from the prior mammogram, the doctor called to tell me the results were "highly suspicious of malignancy." Confirmation of the cancer came on January 12, 2009 following a biopsy. I had triple negative ductal carcinoma. Wow.

In my course of treatment—lumpectomy, four rounds of chemotherapy and 33 radiation treatments—I learned a few things. In younger women, when the cancer is caught early it's usually caught, like mine, in self exams. That's because the cancer is typically fast growing. I hate to think how much mine would have grown if I had waited for my next annual mammogram. I learned there are twenty-six different kinds of breast cancer and a variety of treatments, and that science has made great strides in controlling the side effects. I also learned early detection is extremely important. The sooner the cancer is caught, the better the chances of survival. And hey, no one has ever ignored cancer into remission.

I'm happy to report my last mammogram was back to "no evidence of cancer" and I feel great. Get your mammograms, ladies. Do your self-exams. And help support the Inland Agency's "The Pink Ribbon Place" so women who might not otherwise be able to can get the tests, information and support they need.

P.S. I also learned it was nice to be referred to as "young" again.

"The Pink Ribbon Place" mission is to promote healthy behaviors through education, to provide support to all women going through breast cancer and to expand access to diagnostic services for breast cancer.
